## **SANITARY DISTRICT NO. 1 SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETES ANOTHER SPECIAL PRE-PASSOVER COLLECTION PROGRAM**

On Friday, April 18, Sanitary District No. 1 offered four special collection sites for local residents preparing for the Passover observance. Sanitary District No. 1 had trucks and crews at four convenient locations all day long to assist residents unload their vehicles.

Sanitary District No. 1, is an independent sanitary district within the Town of Hempstead that provides municipal solid waste collection, recycling, transfer and disposal services to approximately 50,000 residents and various commercial and institutional properties in the villages of Cedarhurst, Hewlett, Hewlett Bay Park, Hewlett Harbor, Hewlett Neck, Inwood, Lawrence, Woodmere, Woodsburgh and portions of the unincorporated areas of Lynbrook and Green Acres.

"At Sanitary District No. 1 we are committed to supporting our residents with exceptional and attentive service. The pre-Passover program has been going on for ten years and this year was one of our most successful to date. We had hundreds of individuals and families bring item to our collections points. Our staff assisted them to unload their vehicles. District Commissioners Harry Beltani, Frank Argento and I were at the Lawrence Rail Road Station site where we were greeted by dozens of appreciative residents," said James Vilardi Sanitary District No. 1 Chairman.

Collections in the past have been significant. This year the District collected a total of 15.58 tons at the four special pickup locations at the Lawrence and Cedarhurst Long Island Rail Road stations, Young Israel Synagogue in Woodmere and Temple Hillel in North Woodmere. A standard truck used by the District holds approximately 9 tons of refuse.
